

TERMS OF REFERENCE

National Sports Tribunal Advisory Group

Purpose

The National Sports Tribunal (NST) Advisory Group brings together individuals with relevant expertise and experience to provide advice and guidance on the establishment of the NST to the Sports Integrity Taskforce.

Roles and responsibilities

- Contribute industry experience and expertise to the development and establishment of the NST.
- Consider discussion papers prepared by the Sports Integrity Taskforce and provide strategic advice on matters identified.
- Provide advice on sector expectations and related risks and opportunities.
- Assist in advancing more complex elements of establishing the NST by acting as a 'sounding board' for the Sports Integrity Taskforce on such matters.
- In the spirit of open and candid consultation, recognise they will have access to materials that are not yet public and treat those materials with the appropriate discretion.

Membership

Membership of the NST Advisory Group represent a broad range of stakeholders including from national sporting organisations, state departments of sport and recreation, ASADA, the Anti-Doping Rule Violation Panel, other government agencies and athlete/players associations.

Officials/Advisors, sourced primarily from Sports Integrity Steering Committee Agencies, will be available to assist the Advisory Group's deliberations and to explain and provide context for the proposals under consideration.

Secretariat support will be provided by the Sports Integrity Taskforce.

Meeting frequency

The NST Advisory Group will meet as required where input and/or comments on key project deliverables are needed. Meetings will take place either in person or via teleconference.

Proxies and Changes of Membership

Members of the NST Advisory Group have been selected based on their expertise and experience in their field, as such, it is preferable that members do not delegate others to participate in meetings on their behalf.

Where a Member of the NST Advisory Group is no longer able to participate, decisions regarding a replacement will be made by the Sports Integrity Steering Committee.
